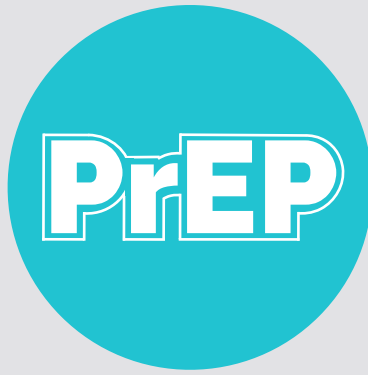

Get Covered *during* Open Enrollment (NOV 1 - JAN 31)

To enroll, visit MarylandHealthConnection.gov

You may qualify for financial help to lower the cost of a health insurance plan if you enroll through Maryland Health Connection. Eligibility is based on income.

3 ways to get financial help:

1. *Medicaid*– offers free or low-cost coverage
2. *Tax credits*– help lower the cost of your monthly premium
3. *Cost-sharing reductions*– reduce the amount you pay out-of-pocket of benefits. You must select a Silver-level plan to get this type of financial assistance.

Carefully select the right plan for you by considering the deductible-- the amount of money you'll have to pay before the insurance helps pay for services. Also consider prescription costs, and make sure your preferred doctors accept the plan and insurance company you select.

Applying *outside* Open Enrollment (FEB 1 - OCT 31)

Enrollment is year-round for Medicaid and for people with certain life changes.

You may qualify for Medicaid if your income is below \$16,753 for a single person or up to \$48,560 for a family of four.

If you have a life event, such as changes in income, losing health coverage, getting married, having a child, or moving into Maryland-- you may qualify to enroll in a health plan through Maryland Health Connection. Find out more by visiting MarylandHealthConnection.gov

You may be able to get help with prescription drug costs if your income is between \$16,242 - \$62,500. Enroll in the Gilead MAP at truvada.com/Truvada-Patient-Assistance. If your income is over \$62,500, you'll likely pay the retail cost of Truvada

Maryland Health Connection

The Affordable Care Act (or ACA) makes health insurance easier to get and more affordable for many people with HIV.

You can now buy your own coverage from the Maryland health insurance marketplace. Financial assistance may be available to reduce how much you pay each month for your insurance and also what you pay out of your own pocket when you seek medical care.

You may be eligible for financial help in the marketplace if you don't have another source of coverage and you earn between \$11,670 and \$46,680 as a single person (income ranges vary depending on your family size).

Plans sold through the health insurance marketplaces must provide a minimum set of health benefits. These include benefits you may find especially helpful for your HIV care, like prescription drugs, doctor visits, hospital care, mental health care as well as certain preventative services, including HIV tests.

In the fall, you can go online, or get assistance in person, to buy your own plan in the health insurance marketplace. During the open enrollment period you can select new coverage or choose a new plan. You can also get coverage outside open enrollment if you have certain life changes and special circumstances such as getting married or losing other health coverage.

Medicare

Medicare is a federal program, managed by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. You're eligible for Medicare if you're 65 or older, or under 65 with certain disabilities. Medicare beneficiaries can generally get their health coverage in two ways: through Original Medicare, or through a private Medicare Advantage plan.

Original Medicare comes in two parts:

- **Medicare Part A** (hospital insurance): This covers inpatient hospital, skilled nursing facility, hospice, and home health care.
- **Medicare Part B** (medical insurance): This covers outpatient medical care, including (but not limited to) doctor visits, durable medical equipment, lab tests, and preventive services.

Medicare Advantage:

- **Medicare Part C** (Medicare Advantage): Medicare Advantage plans provide Original Medicare benefits through private insurance companies. There are many types of Medicare Advantage plans, such as Preferred Provider Organization (PPO) plans and Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) plans. In addition to what's covered under Original Medicare, some plans offer other benefits, such as routine dental and vision, health wellness programs, and prescription drug coverage.
- **Medicare Part D** (prescription drug coverage): Original Medicare doesn't include prescription drug benefits, except in certain situations. You can sign up for prescription drug coverage through a separate Medicare prescription drug plan, or through a Medicare Advantage Prescription Drug plan.

How to sign up for Part A & Part B:

- Apply online at Social Security.
- Visit your local Social Security office.
- Call Social Security at 1-800-772-1213

If you're automatically enrolled, you'll get your Medicare card in the mail 3 months before your 65th birthday or your 25th month of disability.



MADAP (Maryland AIDS Drug Assistance Program)

The Maryland AIDS Drug Assistance Program (MADAP) ensures that people living with HIV/AIDS in Maryland have access to the medication they need to stay healthy. MADAP is a statewide program and is funded primarily through the Ryan White CARE Act. MADAP pays for medications for eligible clients with no insurance and helps clients with insurance by paying for eligible co-pay and deductible costs so they can get their medication.

To qualify for MADAP services, a person must meet the following criteria:

- Be diagnosed as having HIV;
- Qualify financially (anticipated gross annual household income must be at or below 500 percent of the current federal poverty level for the size of the legal household - 2019: \$62,450)
- Be a resident of Maryland;
- Not be eligible for Maryland Medical Assistance (Medicaid);
- Submit a complete MADAP application with required documentation.

MADAP-Plus

The MADAP-Plus program helps people living with HIV/AIDS in Maryland access medication by paying premiums for health insurance plans with prescription coverage (or prescription plans) for eligible clients.

To qualify for payment, the health insurance must meet the following minimum standards:

- a formulary (list of medications covered) comparable to MADAP's
- a coverage cap greater than \$2,500

To qualify for MADAP-Plus, a person must be eligible for MADAP, be responsible for paying 50% or more of their health insurance premium, and have completed the insurance section of the MADAP Combined Application (with required documentation). A copy of the person's current insurance premium bill must be included with the application.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

SNAP is a federal government food-aid program that provides assistance to food-insecure individuals. Eligibility for the program is dictated by household income, and benefits are calculated based on the number of people relying upon that income. Those enrolled in SNAP receive a monthly stipend loaded onto a payment card—much like a credit card—and can use this money to buy food products from most food retailers.

Applicants must file an application, be interviewed, and meet all financial and technical eligibility factors prior to issuance of benefits. Some people who have little or no money may qualify for Expedited Food Supplement benefits right away. They must have only an interview and verify identity.

Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA)

TCA provides cash assistance to families with dependent children when available resources do not fully address the family's needs and while preparing program participants for independence through work.

To be eligible for TCA, a family must cooperate with child support, participate in work activities and comply with substance abuse provisions. Adults with dependent children applying for TCA must meet financial and technical eligibility requirements. Earned and unearned income cannot exceed the benefit level paid for the assistance unit size. Sanctions may be imposed for not complying with program requirements.

Temporary Disability Assistance Program (TDAP)

Provides a state-funded cash benefit to eligible disabled individuals and other services to disabled adults who are ineligible for other cash assistance programs. The TDAP program provides cash benefits to eligible disabled individuals. Eligibility requirements include verifying the disability (a licensed medical practitioner must complete a medical report). TDAP applicants who are disabled for 12 months or more must file an application for Supplemental Security Income (SSI). TDAP recipients may receive benefits for only 12 months out of a 36-month period unless they are pursuing SSI.

There are two programs for the disabled that are administered by the Social Security Administration.

1. Supplemental Security Income (known as SSI); and
2. Social Security Disability (known as Social Security or SSDI).

Every patient with a diagnosis of AIDS may be eligible for one program or both.

These programs have two main criteria that are assessed to determine your eligibility. For SSI, they assess your medical condition and your current financial situation (monthly income, assets, etc.). For SSDI, they assess your medical condition, and they review your employment history to see how much and how long you have paid into Social Security (FICA on wage stub) through your employment.

Both SSI and SSDI use the same medical criteria to determine whether or not you are disabled. "Disability" is defined as any medical condition (physical or mental) which prevents or is expected to prevent you from working for a minimum of 12 months or will result in your death. People who have a Centers for Disease Control (CDC) diagnosis of AIDS (KS, PCP, etc.) may be presumed disabled, thereby meeting the medical criteria for both SSI and SSDI. People who have an AIDS-related diagnosis are evaluated on a case-by-case basis but are not automatically presumed disabled. Below is a more complete outline of both of these programs to help you determine your eligibility and prepare you for applying to these programs.



Social Security Disability (SSDI)

Who is eligible?

In order to qualify for SSDI benefits, you must be determined disabled (see above), and you must have paid into the Social Security system through your employers five of the last ten years. This means you must have worked in a job or jobs where Social Security taxes (FICA) were withheld from your paycheck.

When should I apply?

SSDI benefits are payable no earlier than five months after onset of disability. What this actually means is that during the sixth month after you stop working due to the onset of your disability, you are eligible for payments, but they often do not arrive at your door until the seventh month. Exceptions: If you have been disabled for five months or longer, benefits are payable more immediately, generally between 8-10 weeks.

How much are the benefits?

There is no fixed amount that is paid. The amount of your benefits depends entirely on your earnings: how much and how long you have paid into the Social Security system.

How do I apply?

Call the Social Security Administration's toll-free number 1-800-772-1213. You can also go to any of the local Social Security offices. We suggest that you make an appointment first. However, you may just walk in. Let them know that you have HIV infection or a diagnosis of AIDS so they will expedite your application.

What do I bring with me?

The following is a list of the documentation you need to bring in when you apply. But do not wait until you have everything to go and apply. Bring as much as you can to the initial appointment, and you will have some time to gather the other information that you need.

Bring:

1. A letter signed by your doctor stating your diagnosis and when you were diagnosed.
2. Your social security number (SSN) and card, and any other SSN's on which you have ever received social security benefits (parents, etc.).
3. A certified copy of your birth certificate.
4. A list of all aspects of your condition which prevent you from working.
5. A list of all treating sources (complete names, addresses, telephone numbers for all doctors, hospitals, clinics), dates and types of treatment received, any hospital or clinic numbers. List of all medications you are taking for your condition. List of restrictions placed on you by your physician.
6. W-2 forms for the last two years. If W-2's are not available, bring names and addresses of employers for the last two years.
7. Be prepared to describe the types of jobs you have held for the last 15 years.
8. If previously or currently married, name of spouse & dates of marriage(s), spouse's SSN



Supplementary Security Income (SSI)

How do I apply?

See section on Social Security Disability.

Who is eligible?

In order to qualify for SSI, you must be disabled and have a financial need. If you are disabled and have no income, or less than \$733 per month for an individual or \$1,100 per month for a couple you are eligible for SSI. You do not have to have worked to receive SSI benefits. Basic eligibility criteria are:

1. Your assets cannot exceed \$2,000 for an individual or \$3,000 for a couple.
2. Your monthly income must be below \$733 or an individual or \$1,100 for a couple.**
3. If you own a house, you must live in it to be eligible for SSI.
4. You may have up to \$1500 set aside in burial funds for yourself and/or your wife/husband.

When should I apply?

The general processing time for an SSI application is between one and three months. Benefits are retroactive to the date that you applied for them.

How much are the benefits?

SSI benefits pay up to \$733 per month for an individual or up to \$1,100 per month for a couple if you have no other income.**

** These amounts change every January but the asset resource limits stay the same.

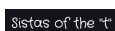

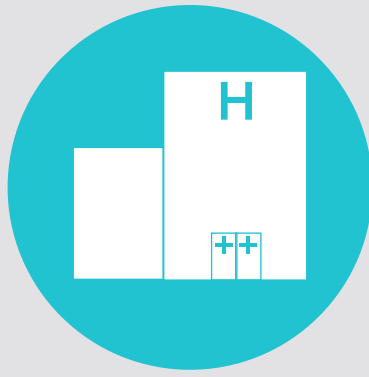
